

Illinois Council on Long Term Care In-Depth Training for Wound Care Nurses – MDS 3.0 Update

Seminar Purpose

OBRA F-314 on pressure ulcers requires accurate risk assessment of the resident, specifically-measured wound assessment, wound classification, wound treatment, and detailed documentation. The new MDS 3.0 requires even more clinical expertise to fill out the new and expanded Section M on Skin Conditions accurately and completely. The facility treatment nurses **MUST** be adequately trained in the above techniques and documentation in order to be successful, both with MDS 3.0 and OBRA F-314.

Previous wound care seminars have covered the revised rules, regulations and proper protocol to follow for compliance with F-314. Due to changes in the MDS 3.0, greater enforcement emphasis on proper wound care, and member request, the Council is again repeating the all-day, in-depth seminar for nurses to learn the skills and procedures needed to be successful in the assessment and treatment of wounds.

Objectives - By the conclusion of this all-day seminar the participants will be able to:

1. Differentiate among different types or categories of wounds;
2. Accurately assess the resident and the wound;
3. Identify dressing categories and goals of wound therapy and infection control;
4. Discuss OBRA regulations F314 and document appropriately for MDS 3.0 Section M; and
5. Complete accurate treatment orders and treatments.

The speakers for this seminar will be **Carol L. Walters, MSN, RN, CWCN**, independent wound care consultant, and **Susan Duda Gardiner, BSN, RN, LNHA**, the Council's Director of Clinical Services.

This seminar is relevant for DONs, ADONs, wound care treatment nurses, and those responsible for assessment and treatment of wounds, as well as administrators who must know what a wound care protocol must contain in order for the facility to maintain compliance under a more stringent enforcement spotlight.
